

The topic area for this EG is cross sector as AGM is a pest that can affect several commodities and its pathways of introduction are largely conveyances and cargo (not commodity specific)

Progress Report 2019

- Mexico's AGM program continued development
- Consideration of AGM program expansion (e.g. other species using vessel pathway)
- Validation of Specified Risk Periods for AGM in Regulated Countries of Origin





Why Review?

- Evidence that AGM flight is occurring outside of the current Specified Risk Periods (SRPs)
- Revisions to further minimize the risk of AGM introduction to North America
- Simplify AGM program requirements for shipping industry to increase compliance and facilitate trade



What We Did

Reviewed and evaluated data

Data and information included (where available)

- Trapping data
- AGM inspection reports in AGM-regulated countries
- Reports of occurrences of live adults from web sites
- Climate data

Method

- Each source of data was evaluated
- Evaluations were considered together and summarized



Preliminary Results

- Potential adjustments to SRPs in Russia and Japan
- CFIA and APHIS AGM EG members met with national plant protection organization representatives of Japan and Russia in late summer 2019 to discuss proposed SRP revisions
- No changes to SRPs in China and Korea at this time, pending available data

Implementation

- will require co-ordination between NPPOs in regulated and regulating countries, inspection and certification bodies and marine shipping industry.
 - policy revision and alignment
 - transition period
 - notification and outreach



AGM EG Activities for 2020-2021

- Prepare NAPPO EG paper and make recommendations for changes to Specified Risk Period
- Continue discussions with AGM-regulated and AGMregulating NPPOs and industry on implementing changes to Specified Risk Periods
- Continued support for Mexico's development and implementation of an AGM program
- Evaluate whether other species should be included in AGM program
